Milford High School Athletics 2013-14 Year In Review

The 2013-14 academic year was a successful one for the Milford Eagles. Among the high points were three conference championships and many individual accolades. Here are the highlights from the recently completed year.

- A total of 624 student-athletes competed in at least one sport; 61 teams were led by 94 coaches.
- Teams combined for a final record of 204-147-8 (.579) and 71-51-2 (.581) in Eastern Cincinnati Conference play. School finished fifth in the ECC All Sports Trophy standings.
- Softball captured its first conference championship in school history, winning the Eastern Cincinnati Conference.
- Baseball won a share of its third straight conference championship and 15<sup>th</sup> overall.
- Girl's Golf won its second straight ECC Championship.
- Baseball won sectional championship and earned district runner-up honors.
- Milford celebrated the installation of new turn in the football stadium on Sept. 6.
- Girl's Basketball posted the greatest win-loss turnaround from last season (+11 wins) of any girl's basketball team in the Greater Cincinnati area and finished the season as the only ECC member to win a tournament game with opening round win over league rival Turpin.
- Girl's Volleyball won back-to-back five set matches to open the OHSAA Sectional Tournament, overcoming 2-0 deficits in each.
- Girl's Water Polo finished fourth in the regional championships, coming up one goal shy
  of a trip to the state championships.
- A Dance team contingent captured a National Championship in jazz category at the Jamfest Super Dance competition.
- Senior Carolyn Stoch earned honorable mention All-American honors in water polo.
- Seven student-athletes were All-Ohio selections: Lindsay Bugajski (Girl's Water Polo), Josh Fritz (Boy's Water Polo), Kayla Gregory (Softball), Thomas Moore (Boy's Soccer), Andrew Minton (Baseball), Kyle Ruehlman (Baseball) and Carolyn Storch (Girl's Water Polo).
- Football senior Thomas Moore was named second team All-Southwest District, first team SWOFCA All-City as a punter and second team as a kicker. Thomas was also a first team All-Southwest District selection for soccer.
- Junior Erin Beurket and senior Mackenzie Kern from Girl's Soccer earned All-Southwest District honors.
- Volleyball senior Jessica Winstel earned third team All-City District 16 honors.
- Sophomore A.J. Erdaty qualified for the Boy's Cross Country Regional Championships.
- Junior David DiSilvestro and sophomore Aunjela Latham represented Milford at the Track
   & Field Regional Championships.
- Seniors Racheal Mitchell and Brandi Norman qualified for the Girl's Bowling District Championships.
- Seniors Jake Ashcraft and Jake Noll qualified for the Wrestling District Championships.
- Freshman Nathan Arnold, junior Megan Creager and senior Aly Severns qualified for the Golf District Championships.
- 11 student-athletes represented Milford at the Boy's and Girl's Swimming District Championships.
- Boy's Soccer Head Coach Brian Croston became the winningest coach in school history with win number 100 in the Eagles' OHSAA Tournament win over Colerain on Oct. 15.
