## Milford High School Athletics 2014-15 Year In Review

The 2014-15 academic year at Milford High School was filled with many memorable moments and outstanding performances by the school's outstanding student-athletes. Prior to the year, a number of goals were set forth in the district's Athletic Department Strategic Plan. Among the accomplished highlights from those objectives was:

- Maintain a 3.0 or higher in-season GPA for at least 90% of all MHS programs as measured quarterly either during or at the conclusion of each program's season. The student-athletes combined for a 3.3 overall GPA.
- Reach a social media exposure level of at least 20,000 average monthly website visits,
   1,000 Twitter followers and 700 Facebook likes. The district averaged 24,565 monthly website hits, totaled 1,499 Twitter followers and 844 Facebook likes.
- Finish in the top-three of the ECC All-Sports Trophy standings. **Milford finished a best- ever third in the standings.**
- Win at least five ECC team championships. **Milford won five championships in boys** golf, girls golf, boys basketball, baseball and softball.

A more detailed look at the highlights of the 2014-15 academic year achieved by Milford High School coaches and student-athletes:

- Teams combined for a final record of 230-127-9 (.641) and 93-44-4 (.674) in Eastern Cincinnati Conference play.
- School finished a best-ever third in the ECC All Sports Trophy standings.
- Baseball won its fourth straight conference championship and 16<sup>th</sup> overall.
- Boys Basketball became the first Milford team since the 1970-71 season to advance to the OHSAA District Finals, while setting school records previously held by the 1970-71 teams for wins in a season with 22 and consecutive victories with 18.
- Boys Basketball was one of only three teams in the Greater Cincinnati area to increase its win total by at least 10 victories from last year after winning 12 games in 2013-14 and 22 in 2014-15.
- Boys Golf captured its first ECC Championship and first in any conference since 2008.
- Girls Golf won its third straight ECC Championship and advanced as a team to the OHSAA Southwest District Championship for the first time in school history.
- Softball captured its second consecutive Eastern Cincinnati Conference Championship and advanced to the district finals for the first time since 2004.
- Girls Water Polo finished fourth at the Ohio Water Polo State Championship, falling in a heartbreaking overtime decision in the third-place game.
- Senior Megan Creager became the school's first-ever representative at the OHSAA Girls Golf State Championship where she ended tied for 16<sup>th</sup> overall.
- Junior Clare Cartheuser set a school record in the discus throw en route to a 10<sup>th</sup> place finish at the OHSAA State Girls Track and Field Championships.
- Junior Arija Walsh was selected to participate in the USA Water Polo National Team Selection Camp.
- Six student-athletes were All-Ohio selections: Sydney Connor (girls water polo), Skyler Fontaine (girls water polo), Ben Greenwell (football), Tyler Karan (boys water polo), Lindsay Matulis (girls water polo) and Max Woodson (boys water polo).
- Boys Basketball senior Will Hannah was a first team All-District 16 and honorable mention All-Southwest District selection.
- Girls Basketball junior Kelly Noll was an All-Southwest District honorable mention selection.
- Football junior Ben Greenwell earned first team All-Southwest District honors as a punter.
- Softball sophomore Kelsey Seitz was a first team All-Southwest District selection.
- Senior David DiSilvestro and junior Clare Cartheuser represented Milford at the Track & Field Regional Championships after winning the 300 meter hurdles and discus district championships, respectively.
- Junior Josh Brooksbank and freshmen Josh Cooper and Nathan McGeorge qualified for the Boys Bowling District Championships.

- Junior Sarah Schmidtgesling and sophomore Alyna Hook qualified for the Girls Bowling District Championships.
- Junior Zach Lorenz, sophomore Cole Dunham and freshman Joel Adams qualified for the Diving District Championships.
- Sophomore Nathan Arnold qualified for the Boys Golf District Championships.
- Seven student-athletes represented Milford at the Boys and Girls Swimming District Championships.
- Freshman Amanda Reinhart earned a berth on the Girls Tennis District Championship.
