# Milford High School Athletics 2020-21 In Review

The 2020-21 school year was another great one for Milford High School Athletics. In the midst of a global pandemic, the Eagles captured four Eastern Cincinnati Conference Championships, OHSAA District Finals appearance by the girls soccer squad and four individual state championship qualifiers.
