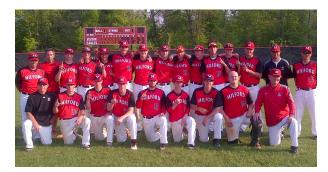

2015-16 YEAR IN REVIEW

The Milford High School Department of Athletics enjoyed another year of success during the 2015-16 academic year highlighted by three Eastern Cincinnati Conference Championships, a final finish of fourth in the league's all-sport standings and a regional runner-up finish by the Milford baseball team. A more detailed look at the highlights of the 2015-16 academic year achieved by Milford High School coaches and student-athletes:

- Teams combined for a final record of 212-125-9 (.626) and 95-44-3 (.680) in Eastern Cincinnati Conference play.
- MHS finished fourth in the ECC All Sports Trophy standings.
- Senior multi-sport student-athlete Loewen Cavill was named a 2015 Wendy's High School Heisman State Finalist.
- 10 student-athletes were All-Ohio selections
- Four ECC Athletes of the Year: Joel Adams (Diving), Nathan Arnold (Boys Golf), A.J. Erdaty (Boys Cross Country) and Brad Hall (Baseball).
- Four ECC Coaches of the Year: Christy Gregory (Softball), Tom Kilgore (Baseball), Phil Sheldon (Boys Golf) and Harry Smith (Academic Team).
- 42 First Team All-ECC honorees
- 36 Second Team All-ECC honorees
- 22 Cincinnati Enquirer All-Stars
- 30 seniors committed to play collegiate athletics
- 5 teams finished in the top-10 of the Cincinnati Enquirer weekly coaches polls



BASEBALL / SOFTBALL

- The baseball team won its first district championship since 2003 and advanced all the way to the OHSAA Regional Finals. The team also finished third in the Ohio High School Baseball Coaches Association's final state poll.
- Baseball won a share of its fifth straight conference championship and 17th overall.
- Softball won its third straight Eastern Cincinnati Conference Championship. In the process, the Eagles became the first team in league history to finish undefeated in conference play in a single season.
- Cincinnati Enquirer Co-Area Players of the Year: Wes Reid (Baseball), Valerie Thompson (Softball)

BASKETBALL

• The girls basketball team enjoyed arguably the best season for the program in nearly 20 years as the Eagles finished with 18 wins, the most since 1996-97. They were also one of only four teams in the city to improve its win total by at least 10 victories from last season.

CHEERLEADING/DANCE

• The MHS Cheer squad took first place at the ECC Championships, while the Dance team placed second.

CROSS COUNTRY

• Senior A.J. Erdaty won the ECC Boys Cross Country Championship race.

• Sophomore Joel Adams won the ECC Boys Diving Championship.
